## A Message From The Team

The last year has seen us build and strengthen our work at our new home at the Delius Arts & Cultural Centre, and be rewarded with an increased interest and energy accompanying all of our activity.

Artworks is thankful to the Foyle Foundation for a grant which has enabled us to pilot an eclectic programme of exhibitions, events and activities in our new home and increase its reputation as a vibrant arts hub for the City.

The challenges of this year have not been inconsequential but we ended the year on a high note, being both organisationally and financially significantly more stable. This is testament to the hard work of all those who give their time to Artworks; Board, Staff, Supporters and Volunteers alike.

The year has hosted some excellent projects, including the formation of a permanent Stroke Survivors Group running from the venue, some amazing Creative Together projects with families across West Yorkshire and a continuing strong relationship with the Care Quality Commission.

We are extremely grateful to our core funders, Arts Council England and Bradford Metropolitan & District Council for their continuing support through these challenging times and would also like to thank Sovereign Healthcare, NHS Bradford & Airedale, The Lloyds TSB Foundation and Awards for All for their support for specific areas of our work.

Thank you to all of our Friends, Funders, Supporters and Partners for enabling us to continue our work and helping us develop and grow as a team and as an organisation.

## Arts & Health

2012-13 saw our Arts and Health work go from strength to strength. Artworks continued our work for NHS Bradford & Airedale running projects with six partner organisations across Bradford District with a range of hard to reach groups. These included a fantastic project with asylum seekers and refugees in partnership with Horton Housing, increasing participants' understanding of the health system and their ability to describe symptoms. We also ran a popular project with members of the older Polish community on healthy lifestyles, and another with young people from the Canterbury Estate to increase positive body image and self-esteem. Our Stroke Survivors project was so successful the group decided to continue meeting and are now regular fixture at the Delius Centre.

Artworks was fortunate to receive a Sovereign HealthCare Foundation Grant and a further grant from BMDC's Wellbeing Activity Fund that enabled us to deliver a weekly wellbeing group for older people.



We continued our work with the Care Quality Commission, University of Central Lancashire and the SpeakOut Network and before the year end were notified that we have received a grant from the Department of Health to continue our training programme with these partners.

Finally, we held a fantastic exhibition of work from the Piccadilly Project on alcohol recovery entitled 'Also Available in Sober' and published the Hidden Voices book, a collection of poetry and images from Bradford's Hidden Homeless.





## Public Arts & Events

With a full programme in 2012/13 our venue, the Delius Arts & Cultural Centre, is definitely on the map for local music promoters and audience goers.

In December we showcased a commissioned performance, 'FRITZ – A System of Weaving', about the life and work of Bradford-born composer Frederick Delius. Produced by local artists Seth Bennett (musician and composer) and Chemaine Cooke (modern space responsive dancer) the event was supported by the Delius Society and was part of their programme of events for Delius' 150th Anniversary.

Drawing Club ran on a weekly basis for over 12-months an un-tutored alternative take on academic-styled life drawing classes, with a different theme of theatrical stage and musical playlist each week. We celebrated the course's achievement with the 'LINE – Life-drawing exhibition' at the end of the year featuring the work of 44 artists (including 15 people's work from the Drawing Club) from around the region, and over 400 people visited the week-long exhibition.

The life drawing theme concluded with 'Spect' An avant garde spectacular of spoken word, live art, and physical performance featuring the work of over 58 contributing artists from around the region.

One of the favourite musical acts from the year was the 'Jaipur Kawa Brass Band' A rousing 10-piece South Asian brass band from Rajasthan including gypsy dancer and juggling sword swallower, they were joined by local band the Family Elan for a night of fusion folk music.

## Children, Young People & Families

2012/13 has been a busy year for Children, Young People and Families. Moving into the final year of our Creative Together project, which continues to work with groups across Bradford, Calderdale, Kirklees and Leeds to encourage families to enjoy learning together, we've run no less than 19 projects. We returned to Communityworks to support previous project participants in setting up and maintaining their own parents and toddler group and we ran another hugely successful Halloween event with the Mixenden community. We also launched a large scale piece of work created with pupils and parents from Two Gates Primary School in Slaithwaite, with 24 panels installed along the bridge across Slaithwaite Reservoir, a project supported by the Canal & River Trust.

We have also worked with young people from Parkwood Youth Centre in Keighley to create mosaic panels based around video games to put their stamp on the newly refurbished space, providing them with the opportunity to contribute to the redevelopment.



We received a grant from Awards For All enabling us to run two Pick Up Your Paintbrush projects teaching DIY and interior decoration skills to young people at Bradford Foyer and Keyhouse in Keighley, with the aim of helping young people to care for their rented properties and maintain their tenancies.





# Training

Artworks has continued delivering our successful nationally recognised PTLTS qualification (Preparing to Teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector) and are gainfully employing many of our recently qualified trainees.

We have taken on further placement students from local colleges to provide them with work experience in project development and delivery, many of whom have gone on to find work as a result.

Other training projects have included the design and delivery of training events for Horton Housing using our skills in consultation and engagement to assist their staff in running a successful consultation event for their service users.



*Income & Expenditure*

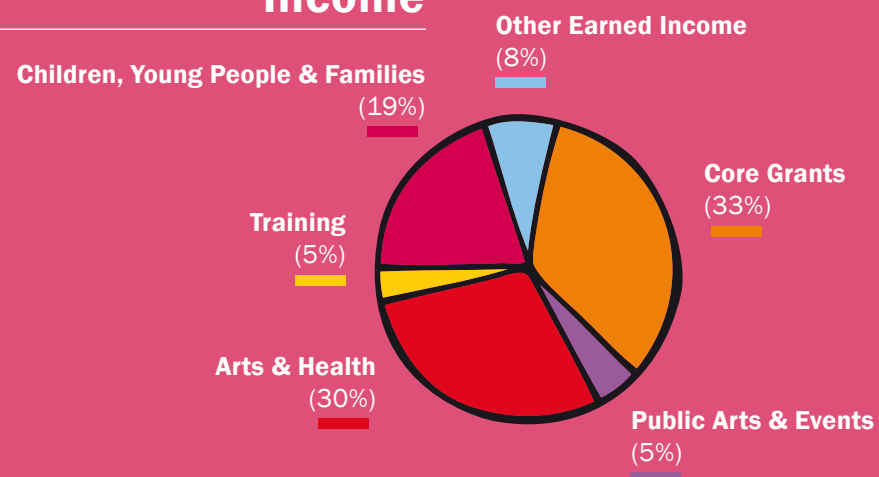

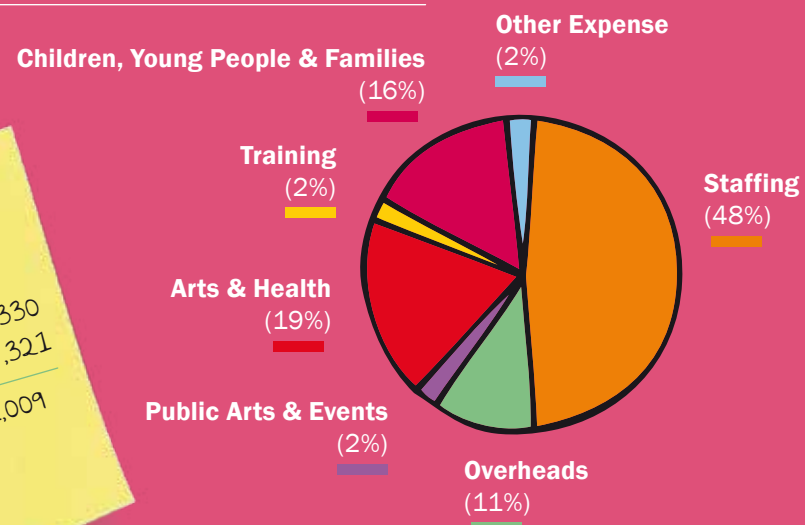
